With all the "giving up" that's done for Lent, why not partner with your spouse this year and give up something together with the goal of helping your relationship? Every couple knows the "obvious" little things they need to work on. For instance, my husband and I really need to dispense with the constant tit-for-tat: "I took the kids to practice five times last week, now it's your turn ..." and "I'm not unloading the dishwasher again until someone else does their share ..."

But Lent is a good time to look to the bigger things, too, the harder things. Lent should be a little difficult. It's the hard stuff that really causes us to think and reflect about how we can change and sacrifice to serve others, perhaps most of all, our spouses.

Here are some other bigger areas of family life to explore "giving up" as a couple as you work toward a stronger, more joyful relationship come Easter:

1. Negativity

Remember when you were first dating? You probably never complained to your beau, always wanting to show your positive side because that's what we find most attractive in other people. But as your relationship grew and you became closer and more comfortable with one another, your significant other became a dumping ground for every gripe, vent and complaint around the clock. Spouses should be there as sounding boards for each other, but you should never underestimate the power of words. Negativity has a way of becoming addicting and satisfying in an unhealthy way. Negative comments, talk, and gossip can eventually spiral and deprive you of the daily joys of marriage and life, according to CatholicMatch.com. And after a while, the words start to personify the speaker.

This season, vow to only communicate by casting a positive light on your day, people you know, things you see in the news. It won't be easy! And of course there will be bad things and problems to point out and discuss, but try to talk about them in a proactive way, with empathy and understanding you might not have verbalized before. When you're positive, you smile a lot more — and what's more attractive than that?!

OVERVIEW FOR THE MONTH

The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph. The entire month falls during the liturgical season of Lent which is represented by the liturgical color purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart.

During this month we will continue our journey to the cross with our acts of penitence. We will reflect on our mortality ("Remember man thou art dust") and the shortness of life ("and to dust thou shall return"). We will heed the call, "Now is the acceptable time, now is the day of salvation (2 Corinthians 6:2)." Just like Our Lord's earthly life every moment of our lives is leading up to the last moment—when for eternity we will either

go to God or suffer the fires of hell. During this month we will go from the suffering of Good Friday to the joy of Easter Sunday. We will trade the purple of penance for the white of victory and resurrection. The feast of the Annunciation, normally celebrated on March 25 [which falls on Palm Sunday], has been transferred to April 9.

As the weeks of Lent progress let us not tire of doing our good works and penance, but continue with the enthusiasm of the catechumens on their way to Easter and Baptism. May our Lenten observance be a joyful journey — and not a forced march. ☐

The feast of St. Cyril of Jerusalem (March 18) is superseded by the Sunday liturgy. The feast of the Annunciation, normally celebrated on March 25, has been transferred to April 9 since it falls on Palm Sunday. It should be noted that the celebration of the Feast of the Annunciation is transferred to a different date if it falls on a Sunday of Lent, during Holy Week, or during the octave of Easter. ☐

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH

THE MEANING OF HOLY WEEK

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Holy Week is most definitely a very sacred time of the year, for it is now that we will commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth. These are the days leading up to the great Easter Feast. The Lenten season of sacrifice and self-denial is about to come to an end, but this coming week is extremely important for all Christians. The greatest focus of the week is the Passion (suffering) and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the events that led up to it.

Historical documents tell us that as early as the fourth century the Church celebrated this "Great Week" with a feeling of profound sanctity. It begins with Palm Sunday, which marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The central feature of the service proper to this day, as it was in the earliest times, is the procession of palms. The palms are blessed and are then borne in procession to the church, where an entry is made with a certain amount of ceremony, after which the Mass is celebrated. The other notable and very ancient feature of the present Palm Sunday service is the reading of the Gospel of the Passion by three readers.

Especially important for Catholics is the Easter Triduum. This is the three days just before Easter. On Holy Thursday, we reenact the Lord's Last Supper, which He shared with His apostles on the night He was betrayed and arrested. This is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the entire liturgical year. At the Mass, the priest will wash the feet of twelve men, just as Jesus did. Also on this night, priests all over the world will renew their sacred vows. This is because, at the Last Supper, Jesus not only instituted the Mass (Eucharist) but also the ministerial priesthood.

On Good Friday, the day of the crucifixion and death of our Lord, we have the veneration of the Cross. A service is held at three o'clock in the afternoon (the hour He is believed to have died) and another later in the evening. We go forward and kiss the Cross in order to show honor and respect for Christ's sacrifice for our sake. There is no consecration of the Eucharist on this day, and the Communion we receive will be from the night before, which has been reserved in the tabernacle.

Holy Saturday is a vigil. We keep watch for the expectant rising of Our Savior. This was the day He went down into the netherworld in order to bring back up with Him into heaven those who had died before His coming. Up to this time, the gates to heaven were closed and no one could go there because of the original sin of Adam. Jesus changed all that. By paying the price for our sins on the Cross, He gained for us our eternal salvation, and heaven was opened once more. Also on this night, persons who have spent months of preparation will be received through Baptism and Confirmation into the Catholic Church for the first time. It is a joyous occasion.

Those who engage themselves wholeheartedly in living the entire paschal cycle (Lent, Triduum and Easter's Fifty Days) discover that it can change them forever. This is especially so of the Triduum which, standing at the heart of the Easter season, is an intense immersion in the fundamental mystery of what it is to be Christian. During these days, we suffer with Christ so that we might rise with Him at His glorious Resurrection. Holy Week is a time to clear our schedules of unnecessary activities. Our minds and hearts should be fixed on Jesus and what He did for us. Let us bear the Cross so that may be worthy of wearing the crown He wore.

People say to me "I've never felt His touch", or they say, "I have never felt the hand of God in my life". What does it mean to be touched by God? What am I saying to you when I say, "He touched me"?

We are not simply physical beings in a material world, we are God's own handy work. With His hands, He touched us, He created us, and He breathed life into us. We are eternal beings made from his hands. We are sons and daughters of the living God. I know I am. Why? Because, "He touched me", and made me His own. Understanding the truth in that, I live a happy fulfilled life, understanding who I really am. God has touched me, He has transformed my life. The way sunlight touches my skin and makes me feel warm, God touches my heart warming my spirit and soul.

There are many ways that we can be touched by God. In this piece, I am going to give a few examples from the ministry of Jesus, of ways that God can touch you. The means, delivery and results of His touch are endless, incomprehensible and everlasting. Recognizing His touch and learning to trust His loving hands can transform and cleanse you, bringing light, liberty and assurance to your life.

God will cleanse you with His touch.

Luke 5:12-16 While Jesus was in one of the towns, a man came along who was covered with leprosy. When he saw Jesus, he fell with his face to the ground and begged him, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" And immediately the leprosy left him.

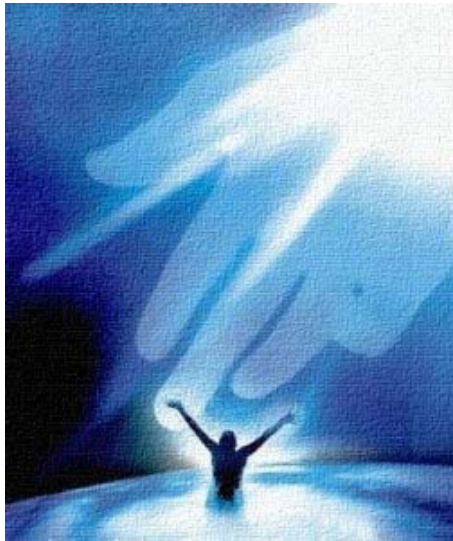
We live in a dog eat dog, anxious, stressful, and hurtful society. Do you suffer from a spiritual sickness? It is easy to become overcome with sickness in our own flesh, living as though we are spiritual lepers, being less than our God wants us to be. But God can and will reach down and cleanse us. He is willing, just ask Him, "Touch me Lord", and you will be clean. Your body, mind and spirit will be cleansed and renewed by His touch.

God will bring you liberty and light with His touch.

Matthew 9:28-30 And when he had gone indoors, the blind men came to him, and he asked them, "Do you

believe that I am able to do this?" "Yes, Lord," they replied. Then he touched their eyes and said, "According to your faith will it be done to you"; and their sight was restored.

Just as Jesus gave sight to the blind men, God brings His light into our lives, so that we have an understanding of Him and His Word. This light enables us to see Him and grow in maturity of the spirit. As we see more, our faith increases, and as a result more of God is revealed in our lives. We grow stronger in His might, as He touches us and brings forth light into our lives to see His truth. What a glorious, illuminating experience that is. As it was with the blind men, God asks of you, "Do you believe I am able to make you see? You only need to reply "Yes Lord". He will touch your spiritual eyes, and according to your faith it will be done unto you. His touch brings you spiritual sight.



Mark 7:32-35 In Decapolis some people brought Jesus a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged him to place his hand on the man. After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus

touched him, putting his fingers into the man's ears. "Be opened!" At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly.

Jesus' touch meant everything to the man who was deaf and could hardly speak. He could not speak because he could not hear. His tongue did not know how to form itself for him to be able to speak as his ears had never heard a sound for his mouth to relate to.

This is true in a lot of our lives. We go through life and we never hear what the Spirit of God is saying to us. We are so busy with our lives, that we cannot hear God, and our words do not reflect God in our lives. We are bound, our hearts are not free to express with our voice the richness and goodness of God, because we cannot hear His voice with everything going on around us. Just as Jesus took the man aside, away from the crowd, God gently takes us by the hand, and walks us away from all the distractions in our life. He does this so He can be alone and intimate with us. Jesus touched the man's ears, and immediately he could hear and speak plainly.

THE ARK ENCOUNTER

It has been said that: NOAH'S ARK IN KENTUCKY MUST BE SEEN TO BE BELIEVED!

On September 28 thru October 1, 2018, pilgrims of The Spiritual Army are set to embark on this spiritual journey, with The Ark Encounter as its highlight. Tour reservations are now in full swing and full payment to be made 90 days before the trip.



In Williamstown, Kentucky, The Ark Encounter, which is as high as a 7 story building, does a fine job of maintaining its motif across its three floors of displays -- and yes, it really does look like an ark inside.

The question here is: "Do you believe?" Is it real or is it merely a fable? Josh Noel of The Chicago Tribune wrote that you don't

need to believe it to enjoy it.

This 510-foot-long, 51-foot-high, 85-foot-wide \$100 million replica of Noah's Ark opened in a rolling Kentucky field and is said to be an undeniable spectacle. It was built according to the dimensions given in the Holy Scriptures.

The Ark is a clean and welcoming space that's a marvel of design. It's clearly meaningful to those who "believe," but to those who are a little less certain, it can be a fun way to pass a few hours. The ark does a fine job of maintaining its motif. Yes, it really does (sort of) look like an ark in there. It's a vast, open space of blond wood, with long ramps connecting its three floors and a clear view to a skylight in the roof. Bathed in yellowish light, it's quite a handsome ark.

The first steps inside immerse a visitor in the premise: Rows of bamboo cages emit chirps, squawks and murmurs from across the animal kingdom, mixed with a recording of the low crash of waves. The rumble is so deep that you feel it in your feet.

Soon after that sense of being on an ark full of animals in a flooded world, we reach cages of life-size beasts. "Skeptics often mock the concept of the Ark and its animals, so they develop questions designed to make the Ark look foolish. However, when one thinks about the Ark from a biblical perspective, the skeptics' questions end up looking foolish. ... What? Why? How? Come to the Ark to understand this!

The opportunities to spend money on the ark are plentiful, with a restaurant, a snack kiosk, the gift shop, a not-so-subtle push toward a visit to the Ark's sister attraction — the Creation Museum, roughly 40 miles north.

The Ark has an array of exhibits and/or experiences of the Garden of Eden, humanity's fall from grace and about humans who are "corrupt" and "wicked" and "vile." Explanations of how the ark would have functioned, how Noah and crew fed all those animals, dumped all that animal waste, ventilate the ship, gather fresh water, let in light -- The Ark Encounter gives us answers in poster and video form, and they involve intricate systems that seem plausible enough.

The Ark is illuminated with rainbow colors in the evening as a testament to the true meaning of the rainbow. After the Flood, God designated the rainbow as the sign of His covenant to never again destroy the whole earth with water.

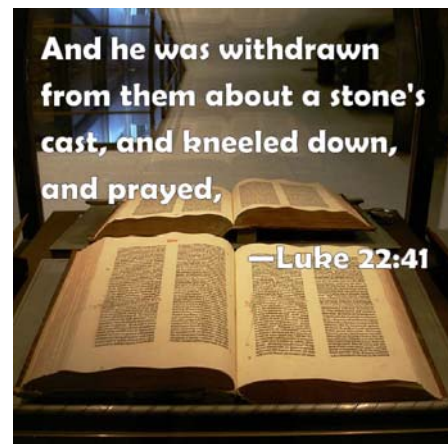

FIVE LENT CHALLENGES FOR COUPLES

2. Consumerism

Like it or not, our wallets are closely connected to our relationships, especially among spouses. In many families, consumerism is out of control. Just take a look in your shower and ask yourself, do you really need those five bottles of shampoo? Was that workout T-shirt from the clearance rack at the big box store really necessary? Good financial habits not only save the family money but can help avoid little (and big) squabbles about credit card bills and clutter taking over the basement and closets — but it also shines a light on consumer ethics.

This Lent, adopt more of a minimalist attitude. Decide together what household purchases constitute a “need” and what doesn’t, and try to buy less. Which brings us to the next challenge on the list ...

3. Clutter

No, cleaning and organizing the house together may not be the idea of a dream date, but your tidy house will lower your stress levels and make you both happier and calmer. If you really want to get ambitious, try to get rid of 40 different things, one for each of the 40 days of Lent.

4. Technology

Grab your smartphone and look at your text app, counting how many texts you sent to your husband yesterday — is texting your main form of communication with him every day? Is email? Modern couples don’t prioritize personal face time to reconnect often enough. Chances are your computer or phone is actually talking to him a lot more than you do.

This is one where you can give up in layers at a time based on your family situation — it’s impossible to totally give up texting while managing kids schedules and coordinating pickups and appointments. But you can decide not to send that funny YouTube video to your wife at lunch, and instead tell her about it instead over dinner. Then maybe you can at least watch it together after the dishes are done. And here’s an ultra-radical idea: you can even try leaving a note once in a while in his bag or briefcase. Would you be able to recognize her handwriting?

5. Binge-watching

Everyone’s favorite wintertime activity! While some research has suggested that watching TV together has benefits for couples, this is still not a substitution for real, authentic connection.

This Lent, estimate how much time you spend each day in front of the TV screen, and agree to spend half (or three-quarters ... or even all!) of that time playing cards, going for a walk, stretching on the floor, or even reading the Bible together. Yes, you may be giving up knowing what happens on your favorite crime-drama at the same time as everyone else, but getting something much more fulfilling and lasting in return. ☐

HE TOUCHED ME

God wants to do the same with you and I. He wants to be alone with us, intimate. He wants to touch our spiritual ears so that we can hear our Masters voice. And if we can hear His voice, our mouths will speak forth of His goodness, salvation and mercy. As a result, our lives and the lives of others will be changed by His touch, as we become His beacons of hope to a lost and dying world.

God’s touch will bring assurance in your life.

Matthew 17 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured, His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. There appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. A bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, “This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!” When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.” When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

There are times in our lives when we become afraid and our lives seem to fall out from beneath us. We crumble underneath the load, weight, fear and strain of finances, marriage, children, job, faith....the list goes on and on. How many times in our lives, do we simply need for God to reach down, and with His gentle touch say, “Get up, Don’t be afraid”? And with His touch, we can rise. And when we get up all the things that were weighing us down, all the fears, all the worry, all the stress and anxiety are gone. When we look up, we see nothing but Him. All we need is that reassuring touch from God. We need to hear the words “Don’t be afraid” spoken by God in our lives, followed by His gentle touch upon us, giving us the assurance that all is well.

So when I say “He touched me”, I mean it. He touches me every single day. He opens my eyes with his touch so that I might see His truth, so that it might be revealed in my life. He opens my ears with His touch so that I can hear His Spirit giving me guidance, correction and understanding. And when I am afraid, His touch gives me the assurance that He is in control, and the things that are weighing me down seem to fade away in His presence. ☐
